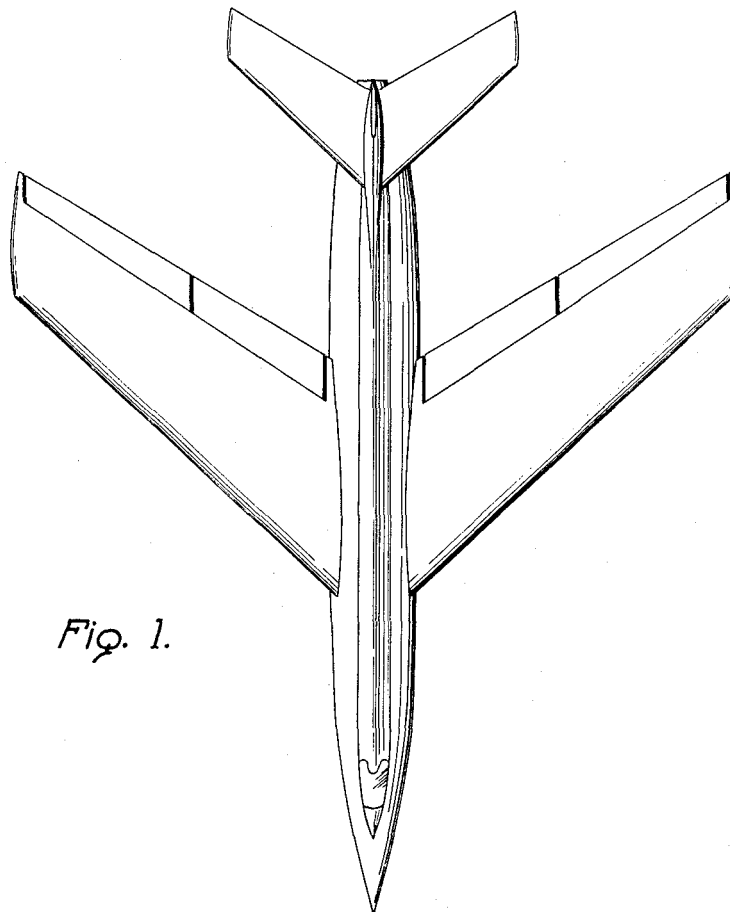
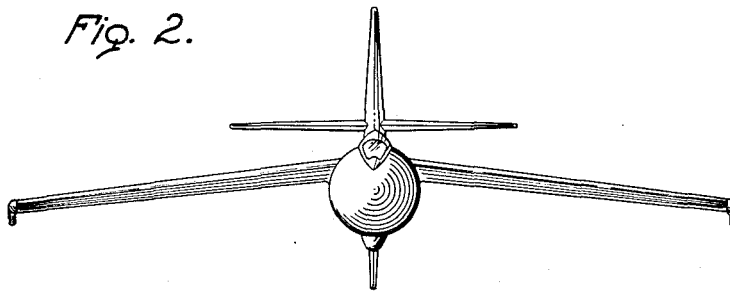
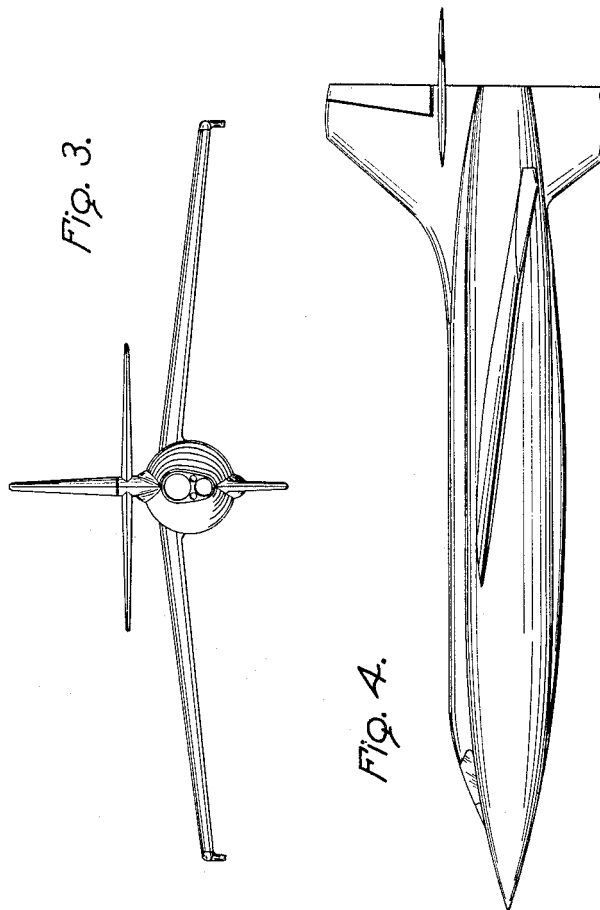

**To all whom it may concern:**

Be it known that We, Roy J. Sandstrom and Robert M. Stanley, citizens of the United States, residing at Buffalo and Kenmore, respectively, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Airplane, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a top plan view of an airplane showing my novel design;
